Dear Sir,

Referring to your letter of the 2nd inst., we have since been going into the matter with our clients, and they have asked us to write to you again about the matter. The property in question was insured by them against Marine Risks and also against the risks excepted in that policy. Under the marine risk policy the goods were only insured to the amount of their cost price, which was between two and three hundred pounds less than the value of the goods at the date when they were destroyed. If the Committee are of opinion that the goods destroyed were covered by this policy, the Company would be only partly insured, and we would submit they would be entitled to claim for the uninsured balance, which is the amount that was actually included in the form sent in.

On the other hand, if the Committee are of opinion that the loss was covered by the excepted risks policy, as under this, the property was insured to its full value, we quite appreciate that our clients could not sustain their claim for compensation.

We should add, however, that the Company with whom the excepted risks policy was taken out have declined to admit liability.

An early answer will much oblige.





As a matter of fact we found that it was not worth this price but are prepared to stand to same.

There is no one in Ireland competent to give an independent value of Jute Salvage.
