There were no Coats approaching this price in the Stock-taking Sheets 31st January 1916, and Claimant could only prove the purchase of two Motor Coats between the 1st February 1916 and the date of the Rebellion. To hack off damaged plaster on walls in two top rooms and Landing. Replaster same gauged with Plaster Paris and finished White.

CARPENTERING.

To take out casement windows of first and second warerooms, hack out the broken glass, repair sashes and frames damaged with new timber, refit sashes, fit slips, casings and fastners required, prepare, Prime and Paint sashes, frames and casings, in 2 coats oil, paint when glazed in plate glass.
