(a)

The Claimant is a Caterer and had a large amount of property at Fairy House Races. He personally listed the articles and dispatched them by Messrs. Beverley Smith's van from Fairy House Racecourse on the night of 24th April. The van reached Fairview in the early hours of the morning, where it was stopped by the Rebels who advised the men in charge not to go into the City. They accordingly drove the van to Cabra and put it in the yard of Mr. Joseph Mooney, J.P. Spme time subsequent to that date (25th) the entire van was ransacked and the prices claimed are the actual value at the time of looting. I have gone through each item with Mr. Mills and find it cannot be upset in any detail; allowing perhaps for some slight overstatement I put the actual value of the property destroyed at Cabra as £60. Some silver property was not taken from the van, but Claimant did not include this in the claim.

Buildings (b) This claim is substantiated by invoices which I secured and attached to file. The only question is in regard to the last item 10/7 for freightage demanded by the British & Irish Steam Packet Co. They are I understand entitled by Statute to their expenses although the goods were not actually delivered.
