I interviewed the claimant herein. The premises were entirely cleared by Cookers on the date mentioned. It appears that the claimants fearing the worst accepted an offer for their stock from a butcher in the suburbs who was to send a truck delivery. The position was that the suburban butcher interests in the buildings was in a position to make a small fortune if he could obtain the stuff to sell, whereas the city man through force of circumstances had to remain closed & the meat therefore would either deteriorate or be spoiled. The cooking happened before the buyer appeared. The claimants had in the meantime made a detailed entry in their books of the amount of stock to be sold & this entry I inspected & found same quite in order. I cannot however accept the claimants' statement that £47.10.0 represents the net cost price of the stock to them or that they were selling it at cost to another butchers who would in all probability make 100% on the transaction. I am quite satisfied on careful inquiry that £40. will amply cover the actual loss. It is interesting to record that the solicitor in the case informed the claimant of £60 with a view to securing prompt & his 'costs' as I am informed. Payment recommended at £40 —
