

Mr. Pierce called on us to-day having received our letter which was redirected to his new address No. 3 Russell Place.

Chambers, 51, Dame Streets,

He explains that it never occurred to him to get receipts for any of the articles claimed, he has given us the following information.

The Cowhide sachet and Betting strap was bought at Messrs Moores, the former about 16 months ago and the latter about two years ago. The Silver badge was bought at Messrs Hopkins & Hopkins 10 years ago. It was made at the instance of the Racing Association. The betting banner was bought at Hughes, Capel, Street about 12 months ago and the poles uprights etc. some in Messrs Parkes and others made in a forge at Constitution Hill. The other articles were got through Mr. Pierce's clerk, but he does not know where. The figures claimed in the claim are what they actually cost him.

Henry Kennedy of 5 Upper Rutland Street, Carter for M. Wall & Sons, went to Fairyhouse on Easter Monday with load of stuff for various parties including the goods claimed by Mr. Mangan and Mr. Pierce. Left Race Course about 9 o'clock that hight with the same goods and got as far as Cabra. Was stopped by armed Volunteers and sent back. Went by North Circular Road and got as far as Railway Bridge. Was stopped here again by about 50 or 60 armed Volunteers, and given ten minutes to take out horse, leaving float and goods there. Having taken horse back to Messrs Wall's yard I did not see float or goods again as I would not be allowed by the Military Authorities\_to remove or touch anything,

When Rebellion over I went up and saw the float broken and goods gone except some betting tickets scattered about the road.
