

Henry Kennedy of 5 Upper Rutland Street, Carter for M. Wall & Sons, went to Fairyhóuse on Easter Monday with load of stuff for various parties including the goods claimed by Mr. Mangan and Mr. Pierce. Left Race Course about 9 o'clock that night with the same goods and got as far as Cabra. Was stopped by armed Volunteers and sent back. Went by North Circular Road and got as far as Railway Bridge. Was stopped here again by about 50 or 60 armed Volunteers, and given ten minutes to take out horse, leaving float and goods there. Having taken horse back to Messrs Wall's yard I did not see float or goods again as I would not be allowed by the Military Authorities to remove or touch anything.

When Rebellion over I went up and saw the float broken and goods gone ~~except~~ some betting tickets scattered about the road.
