I, THOMAS O'FARRELL of Bella Vista, Killiney

in the County of Dublin, Solr.

do hereby SOLEMNLY AND SINCERELY declare :-

ofcurred in the City of Dublin between the 24th April and 29th April 1916. the undermentioned property viz 34 Lower Sackville Street and 1 and 1a and 2 North Earl Street were destroyed, and such destruction was occasioned to the best of my belief, by the firss which followed the disturbances.

the terms set out in the Schedule hereto, and I hold the entire of the said premises under Lease dated the 2nd March 1897 for the term of 997. years from the 25th March 1756 at the parly rent of £36:18: 6. and that I am interested in seeing that all sums allowed by the Government to my tenants in respect of the rebuilding of the premises shall be applied to the rebuilding on a plan which should be first submitted to me, as the repairing Covenants in the respective leases of Mr Tallon and Messrs Noblett Limited are limited to keeping in repair the portions of the premises in their respective possession. Accordingly it is necessary that Mr Tallon and Messrs Noblett should rebuild the premises on an agreed suitable plan.

And I make this declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true and by virtue of the provisions
