Sir,

On Thursday 27th April I brought a party of soldiers with machine gun on my motor car from the corner of Dorset Street & North Circular Road round by Fitzroy Avenue Drumcondra to the corner of Jones Road & North Circular Road.

I was glad to be able to render this assistance but regret to say that owing to the way, the men crowded on one side

of the car, the mud guard
was forced down on the tyre
which was practically a new one
and ripped it right round.

I had to purchase a new
one as per enclosed receipt &
think I should be refunded the
amount. I can produce the
tyre if necessary.

I was unable to get the
name of the officer in charge
as there was sniping going on
around and they hurried off
immediately we arrived at the
destination, and I was not

aware of the damage to Tyre
until I returned home.
