With reference to attached correspondence, I now submit statements marked A & B respectively from Major R.H.Metge & Capt R.C. Metge of this battalion. I have made careful enquiries into the case & so far as I can ascertain, the seeds were in bags & were used mainly to build a barrier in St Mary's Lane and partially to feed several starving horses which I understand were in Messrs G.J. Alexander & Co's yard & were the firms own property.
