

n certify the Leiftenant charge of the Soldiers rained in my room when he ordered the Soldiers to take me down to search the Shop, Their cannot be the slightest doubt as to who took my property, for the military went out of the house without placing me under arrest, and when I went up to my room. I Counted the money, and found there was £ 10 missing,

Vinformed the Housekeeper Mrs Brassil that the Leiftenant took & 10 I went to bed and in orabout five or ten minutes after they broke in the door again and placed me under arrest. I will refer you now to Inspector Bassett D. Mr. O. bollege St, bublin who will be only to pleased to supply you with all the necessary information as regards the Leiftenants name + Regiment.
