Interests in the buildings

The Claimant in this case is a young man of about 24 years of age. He states that the Bicycle was purchased by his brother Charles in April 1913 for £12. 10. 0. (See invoice attached) but Charles sold it to him for £10. in the summer of 1915. He cannot adduce any proof of this. On the morning of 24th April 1916 Charles, who is a member of the Sinn Fein Volunteers, took a loan of the Bicycle and left it in the South Dublin Union in order to join the Rebels there. The military authorities cannot trace this particular bicycle (see papers attached). Charles O'Byrne and a younger brother were arrested and deported but were since released. The letter which Charles wrote from the detention camp at Knutsford to the Provost Marshall, dated 7th June 1916, would lead one to believe the bicycle was still his property. I questioned Edmund O'Byrne closely as to this, but he still affirmed that it was his (Edmund's). Under these circumstances I think it well to report so fully. If the Committee decide to make payment, taking into account the date of purchase and the wear and tear, it could not possibly be value for more than £5.
