Interests in the buildings I have gone carefully into the circumstances of this claim with claimant. From the facts it is quite clear that there were no large numbers of soldiers at the above place (1 R.C.O. & 6 mus) for one day & they did not get any refreshments from claimant. She states however that she gave food to the soldiers in the neighbourhood & in fact to any soldiers that passed as she had heard the military were taking what food they wanted from other shops & she thought it would be better to give it to them rather than have it commandeered. The case in my opinion is a very doubtful one & I think if she were paid the sum of £3. it would amply compensate her for any loss she was at
