Dear Sir,


I beg to send you the claim in duplicate of Mr. Joseph M. Campbell of 18, Charlotte Street, Brighton, England, for a quantity of furniture destroyed in the late rebellion. The claim is made for £400, the amount of the last existing Policy of Assurance. I also send attached to one of your forms an original certified copy of the Policies for £800 and £400 and a compared copy attached to the other form. This I hope you will find correct and in order. The deceased F. F. Campbell, the father of the claimant, who was an Auctioneer and Valuer residing in Dundalk had the furniture, the subject of the claim, insured with the Atlas Assurance Co. when he resided in Dundalk for £800, and then, I understand, for economy reduced it to £400 when he retired from business and went to Dublin and effected a new Policy for £400. After his death, which occurred on the 11th of October 1908, his son J. M. Campbell one of the executors (I, myself, and Mr. T. J. Campbell a Barrister are the others) continued to live at 14, Charleville Terrace, N.C. R. to the 6th of July 1909. He then broke up house and removed the furniture, of which he had made an inventory, to Clery & Co., Sackville Street, Dublin. There was no arrangement made about storing the furniture. It was merely to remain with Clery & Co. pending further instructions. Mr. J. M. Campbell then went to reside in Brighton and the matter passed from his

recollection or immediate attention, and the rebellion broke out and the loss was sustained. If there is any further information or assistance you require me to give I will be happy to afford it.


