I am unable to obtain any definite information regarding this claim. The O.C. No.1 Section Southern Cordon knows nothing of the matter. A Mr. Byrne, 19 Leinster Market, states that he saw a Corpl. of the 8th. Hussars break in and distribute the goods to the people in the neighbourhood, but his unsupported evidence I do not consider convincing.

I am of opinion that the claim should be declined by the Military Authorities and that the Mr. Dunne should put forward a claim to the proper authorities as a case of looting.
