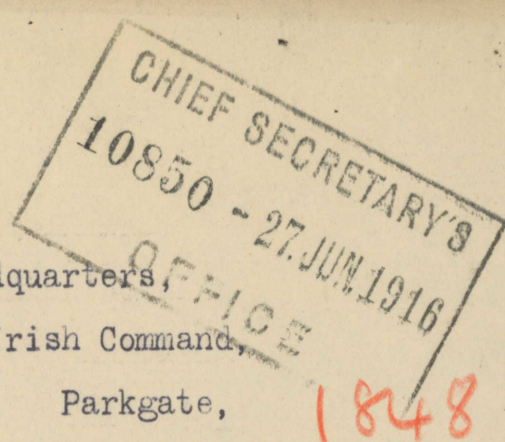

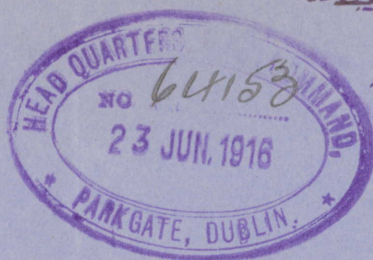

I beg to make another application for some compensation for some articles which were commandeered by the Military Authorities, during the recent rebellion in Dublin. Some months ago I was coming to join my husband in the above city & for safety I pawned my furniture in Messrs Redmond & Co 96 Lower Gardiner Street. Among the various articles pledged was a Bundle of Bed clothing which I had only bought some 4 months before when my husband came home wounded from France the articles cost me some where about ~~£1-5-0~~ £2-5-0.

I wrote to Messrs Redmond sending them some deposits of the articles & they informed me, that



the clothing was commandeered by the military  
Authorities. The original letter I have.

I sent a claim to the Chief Commissioner of  
Police some time ago he replied that he  
had passed it to the military.

So far no action has been taken. Sincerely  
trust you will give this your earliest and  
best attention

I would be very much obliged  
if you see your way to forward a claim  
for a number of articles which were I believe  
commandeered by the military authorities during  
the recent Rebellion from Redmond & Co Pawnbrokers  
96 Lower Gardiner Street.

Some 6 months ago I pawned some bedclothing  
in the above Pawn office, as I was going to join  
my Husband who is at Present stationed in  
Victoria Barracks Belfast, & as I did not  
take any furniture or surplus articles I pawned  
them in Messers Redmond & Co.

I wrote last week to see if they were  
safe & I received a reply to the effect  
that a Bundle of clothing had been taken  
over by the military authorities



The articles are one Pair of sheets which are valued at 6/- one pair of Blankets which cost 16/- one Quilt or Bed cover which is valued at 6/- also 2 Feather pillows & Cases & a Feather Bolster & Case valued at 12/- also a pair of Curtains costing 4/6. the total which is £2-4-6.

Sir I might mention that the articles that ~~are~~ mentioned above were all new, as I had only bought them when my husband came home from France which was near the end of 1915. Enclosed is a copy of the letter I received from Messrs Redmond & Co.

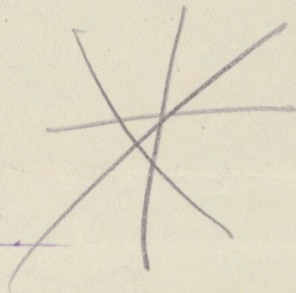
