I beg leave to inform you that on

17th Dec. 1915 I submitted two MSS to Messrs

Maunsell & Co. with a view to their acceptance
for publication in book form. I duly received an acknowledgment of the receipt of the

MSS but when the fire took place at their

establishment during the Sinn Fein Rising, these

MSS were still in their possession, and were
presumably destroyed in the fire. The titles

of the MSS were For the sake of the past and

Memories of the West - Typed. I estimate that

these Stories would - even if sold to a

Newspaper Syndicate have realised at the rate of £1 per 1000 words and as they were approximately 60,000 words in length I beg leave to claim compensation to the amount of £60.

I shall be glad to hear from you in due course.
