I called at 33 Lower Bridge St., Dublin, and found it an Eating House of a very poor description managed by Alfred Bucke who informed me that Kenny's wife called there for letters, he (Kenny) being in South Dublin Union. I therefore visited South Dublin Union and found after a good deal of trouble that Kenny entered there on 19th May and left on 19th July, leaving no address to which I could trace him. I therefore visited Bridge Street again and interviewed Alfred Bucke further. After much inquiry I believe 30/- a modest claim for the grinding machine which was undoubtedly lost. Kenny is said by Union authorities to be of good character, aged 60 years.

Award of Committee: Contents

If payment be made, care will require to be taken that the money finds its way to the Claimant. Bridge Street is a very poor quarter of City.

I wish to forward my claim for damage that was done to my Cutlery Machine which I earned my living by on or about the 26 April I was working in Dorset Street and its vicinity when the soldiers came up to me and told me to leave my machine and get away as there were great danger of me losing my life. I left my machine where it was in Dorset Street. And when I went back when every thing was settled I was told it was made a Barricade off in Brittain Lane. I went there and found it all smashed with one Leg gone and the Peddals gone over
