A REPLY TO A CORRESPONDENT.

THE REDHILL NURSERIES, REDHILL. 5th June, 1916.

DEAR SIR.

In reply to your esteemed enquiry how to make the best use of **RITO** during the summer season, the following hints may be of service.

It is well to remember that RITO is a food for soil bacteria and that all soils that have been broken and exposed to air, contain these bacteria, or as some terms it, "soil organisms." By applying RITO they become active and quickly impart to the plants strong healthy growth, not a forced growth like that when a strong stimulating manure is used.

When it is possible, sprinkle it equally over the ground before digging, using two or four ounces to the square yard, the lesser quantity being for such crops as lettuce, turnips, etc., that are only on the ground for a short time.

Crops already planted and growing will be greatly benefitted by a top dressing of two ounces to the square yard, if possible, hoeing the ground after applying.

Much less quantities can be used with good results, but the above quantities are based on a soil only moderately good.

For Herbaceous and Rose Borders, two ounces to the square vard, lightly forked in will prove ample. Annual borders one ounce per square yard will be sufficient.

For all kinds of pot plants, mix with soil one part to twenty. Some strong feeders may afterwards be benefitted with an occasional surface dressing.

I would like to impress on you the advisability of leaving some of all pot plants and garden crops without RITO that note may be made of the great difference between the treated and untreated, by this means its great value will be more quickly proved.

Although our experiments have been carried on for some time, we are constantly having reports from users of first-class results with much less quantities than those we at present recommend. With this medium for benefitting the ground, the danger from an overdose is done away with.


