Dear Sir. Re my call yesterday informing you  
of my watch & chain being looked. Briefly  
as I can the case is as follows -

From the day the military arrived here  
till they left I was good to them and they  
were many times in my place - some one of  
them rewarded me by taking my watch  
& chain - the first a present of my father  
when I was 21 now 47 years ago and I  
need not say highly valued by me - I cannot  
say who but I may mention that about

6 or in the morning after the soaking rain  
+ April through the night, which was I think <sup>+</sup> Friday  
28<sup>th</sup>

to my surprise I noticed from my bed  
a soldier in the hall who to let himself  
out quietly put hand through the glass which  
had been broken breaking more of it, I did  
not mind this at the time thinking he had  
simply been sheltering in the hall out of the  
rain whilst on sentry - My hall opens into  
my sitting room and within 3 yards of hall  
door is my secretaire in one of the drawers  
of which I keep my "workmans book" and my  
watch (never wearing the watch when at home)  
only using it when requiring to "time" workman  
& yesterday for first time since the rebellion  
I wanted these and found the watch & chain  
were ~~gone~~. I have made as short a  
statement as I can as you asked me to  
on attached I give you description of watch &

I notice your ad in the paper. I supplied a good many of the military stationed at the barricade here but for this I do not desire any payment.

But to get at the rebels the soldiers broke up the hall door and side door of the adjoining house owned by me which will cost me at least £5 to replace, to whom shall I apply for this I had other damage done by the rebels as they got on my building and tore up rails & gates &c to make the barricade.

I have another <sup>matter</sup> of interest to you which I should prefer mentioning privately if you will let me know when it would be convenient to you I will give you a call.
