We have been constilted by our client Mrs Bridget Murray who carries on the business of xxxtauxauxaux restaurateur at 164 Capel Street Dublin regarding damage caused to her shop furniture caused by the removal of same to form barricades by the military on 26th April last.

Our client's furniture suffered considerable damage as a result which she estimates at £16-3-4 and we give below a list showing her loss.

We think it only fair to mention, fearing any misapprehension, that our client, following the general practice which seems to obtain in the city, furnished her claim to the Property Lossese Committee Stephens Green, but we personally are inclined to think, without committing ourselves to this view, that you are the proper authority to deal with her claim. Of course if she is compensated by the military authorities, she will withdraw her claim furnished to the Property Losses Committee.
