I have to inform you that considerable injury was done to the back and roof of this house by rifle fire in the recent rebellion. The top back windows were smashed and the brick work and slates broken in several places by bullets. I am having this

damage made good and I believe that it will cost at least £5 to do this.

I will forward detailed particulars and vouchers as soon as I can, and I respectfully claim to be recouped by His Majesty's Government - the sum I am obliged to expend in making good such damage
