Sir

A son of mine is employed in the Post office as Telegraph Messenger (indoor) and he is not supplied with overcoat or cap, and on ~~the~~ Easter Monday last when the trouble started in the G. P. O. he was on duty in the instrument room and when the rebels entered all the employees was put out (including my son) and they all had to leave their overcoats and caps behind them, otherwise they would have been shot. I have been informed that if I wrote to you that I would be granted some compensation for the loss of his overcoat and cap as they were

only bought a few weeks before Easter and  
as I am a poor man and unable to  
be at such a loss. I would be thankful  
if something could be done in the  
matter the value of the Coat is 25/- &  
2/6. for the Cap. Total £ 1-7-6, if  
receipts are necessary they can be  
obtained
