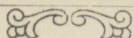

Sir,

I am directed by my committee to point out that during the recent disturbances these premises were forced open by the Military (No one lives on the premises). The Office door was smashed and any drawers or cup boards that were locked forced open. A door on the staircase was smashed and the door leading to the Billiard Room forced. Access was gained to the roof through the Billiard Room and slates were broken, the contractor states, apparently by the butt end of a rifle. Unfortunately the rain came through and wetted the Billiard Table.

The Military left no one in charge of the premises and youngsters entered and

took out billiard and pool balls with cues and hurled them up and down the street. The majority of them were recovered, but very much impaired.

It is estimated that the damage amounts to approximately £10 - and my committee will be glad to learn if any compensation will be allowed by the authorities.

This is a poor association and is strictly non-sectarian and non-political.
