Interests in the buildings

I had a good deal of trouble in tracing this Claimant owing to the insufficiency of the address given.
The Military took possession of some of Claimant's property for barricading purposes. The claim, however, is excessive the articles not having been in good repair. The large item - i.e. Stone wall, £12. - is much exaggerated. The stones were simply taken off the top of it and now lie in Claimant's yard. They only need to be mortared on, and £2. is sufficient for this.

Sir,

I write to bring to your notice the following ^{damage} to my premises at above address during the recent Military operations.

The Lime Stone boundary wall on the western side was taken down by the troops for the purpose of making barricades on the roadway near Harberton Bridge close by 135 feet of this wall was removed & not restored. A small portion of the stone was carted into my yard but the greater part of the material is missing.

I am liable for the keeping

of these premises in proper repair
and I am advised that I will
be responsible for any injury
to persons using the footway
along the road where there is
no protection for the distances
mentioned

A wooden gate on the Northeastern
side was removed by the troops
I cannot say what has become
of it.

In addition to above items
the House by Military fire
was struck in several places
I was obliged to leave with
my family & take refuge with
friends until I could safely
return

I may say that neither I nor any
of my family were Connected, or
associated with the Insurrection
or any of the organisations concerned
with it.

I am a working man and have
been put to heavy loss by the
Matters Mentioned therefore I hope
that you will be kind enough
to arrange that I will be reasonably
compensated

The following is a fair estimate
of the Cost of restoration (1) boundary
wall £15 (2) New Gate £2.10.
(3) Damage to House by bullets
£1.00) Total £18.10.
