We are obliged for your letter of 15th inst and in reply beg to state that having made enquiries from persons who were in the vicinity when our premises were entered by the military they informed us that the troops which did so were of the Leinster Regt (cap badge Prince of Wales plume) and had travelled a good distance, we believe from Cork.

Three or four changes of guard took place but whether of the same regt we cannot say.

The upper portion of the house is used as a factory and is not occupied by any person.

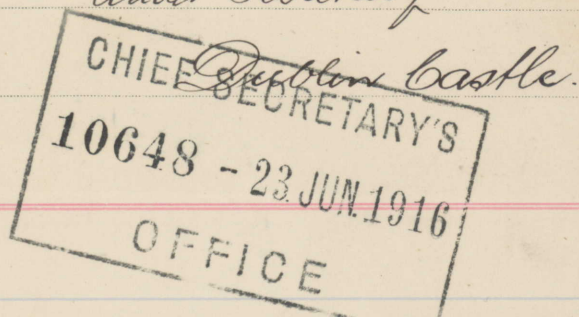
