Sir,

We act as Agents for Captain George F. Wilson of Selby House, Folkestone, for his Dublin property, and he has asked us to send in a claim on his behalf to the Government for £5. 5. 0 which we have paid on his account to Messrs. Graham & Sons, Contractors, 4 Lower Pembroke Street, Dublin, for repairing the roof of house No.13 Percy Place damaged by the Military walking over it during the two days and nights during which they remained in the house, part of the time ~~of~~ the Rebellion was going on which broke out on Easter Monday the 24th April. We know that Miss Hogan, Captain Wilson's tenant of the house, was very thankful for the feeling of protection which she enjoyed while the Military were with her in the house, Mount Street Bridge being quite near. One of the Pillars on the Hall Door steps has been bored right through by a rifle bullet, and Miss Hogan told us it was fired at her door by one of the rebels almost instantly after one of the King's soldiers had stepped into the Hall. We are not asked to make any claim in respect of this particular damage, and which it is intended to leave unrepaired, but Captain Wilson trusts the Authorities will see that it is only reasonable
