The Table claimed for contained patterns - not of the usual type, but really samples of military hats. The trimmings included chin straps. The claimant works on orders for Military Caps for Messrs. Johnston's, Seale's, Clery's, Todd's, &c.

The Watch (15/-) and Blouse Material (5/-) were the property of Claimant's sister Elizabeth who helps her in the business, and the Committee might think it expedient to allow for these two items.


