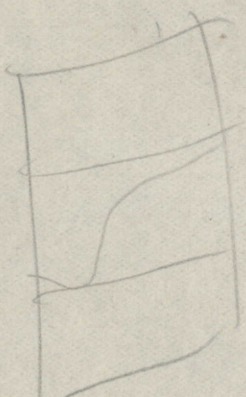

Dear Sir,

I beg to inform you that during the recent disturbances the house and premises situate at 5 Talbot Street, Dublin the property of Mrs Margaret J McGrath ^{the window in the east portion of sd: premises} were destroyed and Mrs Margaret J. McGrath have sustained a loss of £15. 8/-. I have been instructed to claim compensation from His Majesty's Government in respect thereof and I will thank you to please note this claim with reference to the Government Scheme for compensation.
