Messrs.Maunsel and Co.,Ltd.,publishers,50 Loer^w Baggot^A Street,late of 96 Middle Abbey Street,inform me that an MS^β of mine which was in the possession of their firm at the latter address,was destroyed in the destruction of their premises,as a result of the recent rebellion,and they tell me that my claim for compensation should be placed before your Association.

If such a claim is admissible,I hereby beg to apply for compensation to the amount of 19/- (nineteen shillings), same being the value of manuscript destroyed,viz: Typescript of a three-act play entitled "The Supplanter."

I should be extremely grateful if you would forward my application to whatever court or Government tribunal there is to deal with such claims.
