

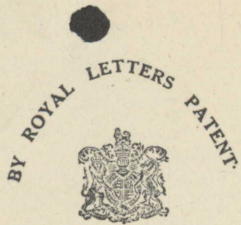

The above was insured by the Institute against loss by fire but the Policy contains a clause, stating that no amount is recoverable for loss caused by "Civil Insurrection".

We beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 7th inst this day received, but we would respectfully point out to you that as you purchased the Billiard table, and as it was therefore your property it is to you we are to look for settlement of the balance due, and even though the Garrison Institute had not purchased the Billiard Seats, they being on Hire to it would be a great hardship on us, to expect us to be at the loss of them, but we do not want any unfair price for them, on the Contrary!

We would have no right to apply to the "Compensation Committee" as the Billiard table &c was destroyed in the Garrison Institute, and was sold to the Garrison Institute by us.

We manufacturers are passing through a very severe time, and we could very badly afford to lose anything at present.


