Dear Sir

This was a small matter and I sent on
a claim for £5 for damage done by the military in
breaking down the door at above premises.

I received 10/- compensation which was wholly inadequate
I had the door mended in a patched up way
and even this cost £2-17-4 - I really think
a new door should have been allowed for.

I sent in several claims on behalf of clients
and they were most fairly dealt with and
most of them paid in full - But this
matter in which I am personally interested has
been dealt with in quite the opposite spirit

and whoever the official is who had charged it
phoned me - saying he could get several doors
of built for £5. This was absurd and I
told him so ^{on the phone} and subsequently asked messrs Jones
contractors of Stephens Green to give an estimate
but they appeared to be too busy and did not
send any estimate. I understood they did
some work & sent some estimates which pleased
the official who had charge of this particular
claim. It is only a small matter but
up to the present it has not been dealt with
in anything like a fair or reasonable way and
I think it well to draw your attention to it.

The Claimant is of the firm of Solicitors - Walsh & Co., 1, Lt. Ormond Quay, Dublin, and I am not a little surprised that such an exorbitant claim is put forward. The entrance from back garden to Stable is by a single door 7' x 3' (not a large double stable entrance door) and this door simply was thrown down by military in searching empty stable. The door should have been renewed some time before rebellion. It is questionable when it received painting. The repairs executed, for which estimate was sent in, comprised two hinges and one small padlock, and I have no hesitation in saying 10/- is more than ample to repair damage (if any). The Claimant is aware of my opinion of his estimate.
