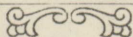

2nd July 1916. Dublin.
To Secretary, Board of Finances for Pass
through Sinn Féin Training.

Dear Sir
On Easter Monday I was
going home to lunch in my
Private Motor Car (an overland) from
the Royal Hotel where I had been
transacting my duties as Officer
in Charge, Army Corps Dublin and
District. When about 4 miles beyond
Glenamoy I was suddenly pounced
on by 4 Sinn Féiners in uniform
who held bayonets at my head
I stoutly I levelled a Revolver at
my head and told me to
get out in the name of the
Irish Republic. I was in no fit
it being Easter Monday I tried
to reason with them but they
were very excited, especially the one
with Revolver. I said if I did not

get out at once they would
fire. so I had to jump up my
car which was taken for a
barrage. I had also in car
a valuable rug selected opossum
skins & fur cloth lining, which
I wanted to take, but had to
leave under threats as they would
not let me approach the car again.

I forwarded an estimate from the
City Wheel Works Co. I believe
one of the most reasonable firms
in the town to make good as far
as possible the damage. for
of course the car can never be
the same. I also claim

\$18.18.0 which is as far as
I can ascertain what it will
cost me to replace this rug.
My wife & child were in the
car with me and got a
great shock, besides being after

unable to get home for 6 days,
which cost much expense & trial.
I trust the Board will give
me authority to have the repairs
to motor & carried out without
delay, & also pay for my time,
as if the Government cannot keep
order they should promptly
compensate, as far as possible
for the damage done to a
Public Servant of the King
performing his ordinary duties &
avocations. I have claimed less
than the loss I have been put to.



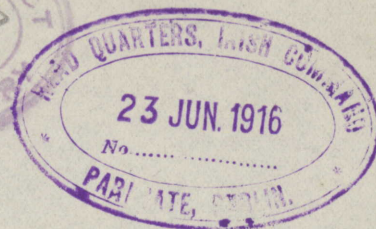
