I beg to make a claim for some articles which I lost during the recent rebellion. I am caretaker of the above Company's offices, at upper Grand Canal St. On Easter Monday we were turned out of the house by the volunteers, and did not get back again until nine days after. We were living in Dalphin's Barn during the week, and when the volunteers left the Company's premises, and the military took possession, there was no guard left, and when we got back possession we found

the articles gone.

The reason that I did not make my claim before this is that my wife was confined a few days after coming home, and was very ill up to the present, the house during the rebellion was under constant fire and hand bombed.
