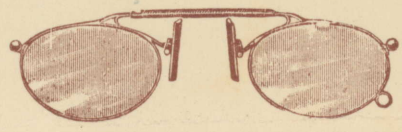

Dear Sir,

Shortly before the Rebellion we left 33 pairs of Scissors to be sharpened at Hugh McNeill & Co., Tool Dealers and Cutlers, Exchequer Street, DUBLIN. He sent them on to P. McGivney, 41, Henry Street, and they were there destroyed during the Rebellion. We have applied to Hugh McNeill & Co. for payment £4.10. 0., as you will see by enclosed letter. He now says we must send in our claim to you. The Scissors cost 3/6 each wholesale and were practically new, therefore, we consider we are entitled to at least £4.10. 0., compensation.

Kindly have this matter seen to <sup>for</sup> us and oblige.
