stored in Claimant's drawing room were rebel barricades. The building in question is next door to the famous Davy's Public House, the scene of the first attack on the military. The Applicant was claiming for the cost of goods and added profit, and this I have rectified. In my opinion there is no excuse for a man, such as Claimant, - who appears to be in a good way of business - not being insured against the risk of Fire.
