In reply to your letter of the 12th instant I beg to state that your claim (No.231^A) in respect of jewellery etc., was reported on to Government on 22nd December.

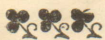
As regards your renewed claim for 12s.3d. on foot of claim No. 231, the Committee regret they are unable to re-open this matter.

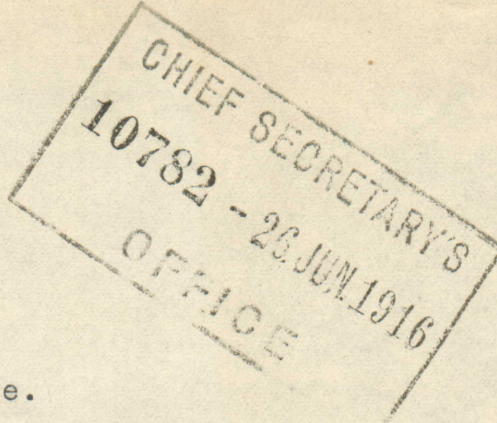

Dear Sir In accordance with your notice, I send you herewith on behalf of my Client Mr William J Egan of 130 North King Street, a Claim for the payment of provisions commanded by the officers and men of the 6th South Stafford Regiment during the period 28th April to 1st May 1916.

I also send you particulars of the value of Jewellery which, according to my instructions, were taken by the military during that time. My Client has of course a Claim for General Damage done to his household amounting to £ 27 odd, which I presume will be subsequently dealt with by the proper authorities and

Consequently I do not know if I am right in submitting the enclosed claim to you. As the claim is however an unusual one and not necessarily the concomitant of the disturbance, and as some investigation of it might be advisable with as little delay as possible, I thought it better to submit it to you. The evidence in support of it, although circumstantial appears to me to be indisputable. My client and his family were on the premises all the time. No other strangers, whether Sinn Féiners or civilians, at any time entered the house. There was no looting by outsiders. The Jewellery was there on the 28 April when the military entered and on the 1st May when they left it was immediately discovered to be gone.
