Now as matters have partly resumed their normal condition I beg leave to trouble you in asking that you may be pleased to grant me compensation to the amount of £10 for damage to my furniture &c. while being used by the military during the recent troubles.

On Wednesday 26th ult. the military took up duty on the North Circular Road and took out my parlour furniture to block up Fitzgibbon Street. To get into the house they had to break the lock on the hall door as my husband was on duty and myself and my six children were out having a walk and no person was in the house. The furniture remained in Fitzgibbon Street until the following Sunday night and was much damaged by bullets, children jumping on it, and by the weather.

I trust you will be able to give my application your kind consideration and favour my request as I have a large family and my husband holds only the rank of Station Serjt. I.M. Police employed at Police Courts and I cannot afford to suffer loss.
