The houses and premises Nos 19 & 21 Lower Bridge Street in the City of Dublin which were partly burned down and otherwise injured during the recent rebellion are my property

I therefore claim that a sum of £2000 (Two thousand pounds) be paid to me for the purpose of restoring the said buildings and premises
