This Claimant's year ended December 31st. His Stock taking was completed within about one week from that date.

Mr Vereker, the Royal Insurance Life Inspector, explains that he had no occasion to visit the Claimant specially about fire business, and as the Claimant would not insure elsewhere, he, Mr Ellis, was simply waiting until Mr Vereker, or some one from the Office, called upon him.

We believe that the Claimant did intend increasing his insurance by £1000, and would have done so had the Insurance Co looked him up-which is usual in such cases- and had Mr Vereker been a Fire, instead of a Life, Inspector, this would certainly, in our opinion have been done.

There is no Claim for Plate Glass in Shop front, returns, doorway, fanlight, window casings, facis & stall boards. These are covered by insurance under the Hibernian Plate Glass Policy, but we presume these items will be included in the Building Claim. The Insurance covers breakage only.

The explanation of claimant regarding the under-insurance on Stock is that owing to pressure of work he had neglected putting on an extra amount of £1000, which he had discussed with the Insurance Inspector during Stocktaking.
