Dear Sir,

On Wednesday 26th April last an Officer, I understand belonging to the Royal Irish Rifles broke open my shop here & damaged door broke lock on same & also a clock in the shop. I was not in or near the shop since the previous Monday & could not get near the place since that day & on the Monday following was surprised to find the place open I heard from the neighbours that it was broken open in consequence of sniping being indulged in. Nobody could have access to window or roofs from my shop which is on the ground floor & consequently
