## Claim for Damages caused during the Disturbances on the 24th April, 1916, and following days.

I Margaret "Peggy" Brennan residing at 88 Regent St. in the City of London do hereby solemnly and sincerely declare that on or about the 28<sup>th</sup> day of April

1916, damage was done to the undermentioned Property, namely:—\* Black Cashmere business dress

and such damage was occasioned to the best of my belief by\*\* Destruction of premises by fire of 11<sup>th</sup> Henry St. caused by rebellion

\*\* Here state cause of damage.

And I further declare that the Property and Articles specified on the other side were so destroyed or damaged; that the Cost Price of same was as shown in each case; that at the time of the destruction or damage they were respectively of the Values specified under the head "Value of Property at time of Destruction or Damage"; and that, in consequence of such destruction or damage, claim is hereby made for the sum specified under the head "Amount Claimed"; that the Claim is made by me as† alone; and that no person is interested in the said property except‡ myself.
