

Referring to the Declaration verifying the claim herein we would be greatly obliged if you would be so kind as to inform us if the Committee consider the explanation as to under insurance adequate. Our client took over the restaurant as a going concern in 1910 and as the business was at a very low ebb on account of previous mismanagement. Messrs. Tyler, who owned it, were so glad to let the premises that they sold him the furniture and fittings at an extremely low figure. Our client unfortunately for himself took this price as the basis of his insurance and when taking out a fresh policy in 1913 made no change in the amount. Since then he was doing so well that he was able to make considerable additions to the furniture and equipment but it never occurred to him that he should increase his insurance in accordance therewith and with the all round increase in prices. It will cost him at least £1250 to reinstate the the restaurant. All his assets were sunk in the business and he has nothing whatsoever beyond what the Committee in their generosity may be pleased to grant him. It is certainly a case for the very favourable consideration which we feel sure they will grant him.
