



Re CLAIM FOR OFFICE FURNITURE ETC.


Dear Sirs,

With reference to my interview with you on the 9th inst. I now send you as requested a list of the Law Books which were burned in my former Offices at 70 Mid. Abbey Street, also Messrs. Hely's Invoice for stationery supplied prior to the rebellion. At the time of the fire, I had one large press, and 5 drawers in a writing desk filled with stationery and law forms and parchments. I purchased my law forms from time to time in Messrs. King, Ormond Quay, Yeates, Dame St. Byrne of Abbey St. and O'Brien & Ards for cash, and they included printed forms used for Probate, Land Registry, High Court, Petty Sessions business, printed Day Sheets, Outlay Dockets. Under the head of stationery I include all my files which were made up of a large patent file for filing costs purchased in Chambers, a large number of Stolzenberg and linen files, and also Manilla cases and Card Board boxes for holding papers, baskets and tins for holding papers on desks, Notepaper baskets, ink stands, agency Account Books, large ledger for Petty Cash, Outlay etc. and all miscellaneous requisites in the Offices.
