Compensation claimed for  
Barrels used by Military.

Co. of Cork E.R.

Mallow 5<sup>th</sup> Nov<sup>r</sup> 1916.

With reference to annexed  
letter I beg to report that these  
barrels are the property of the  
Irish ~~&~~ Improved Roads Coy.

13 South Mall, Cork.

The barrels were used for  
barricading the roads leading  
to Mallow Railway Station  
by the Military on duty there  
from 26<sup>th</sup> Apl. to end of May last.

These barrels were placed at  
short intervals from each other,  
filled with sand, in each of  
which was placed a pole to  
which barbed wire was nailed.

This wire was not nailed to  
the barrels. It was merely  
twisted round them.

I have on this date examined  
some of these barrels, which are  
thrown in an open shed belonging  
to Christopher Lombard, West End,  
Mallow. They do not seem to be  
very much the worse of their  
being used by the Military.

Taking everything into  
consideration 2/- per barrel would  
in my opinion be a fair value  
The Dist. Inspector.

Received 6<sup>11</sup>/<sub>16</sub>  
R.S.

for their wear and tear whilst  
being used as above described.

The Military on duty at  
the time indicated were a  
detachment of the Leinster  
Regt. Victoria B<sup>ks</sup>, Cork, under  
the Command of Major Seymour  
R. D. Fusiliers.

The Irish Improved Roads  
Co. were, at the time of the  
Irish Rebellion Disturbances,  
stoning and tarring the Mallow  
streets, and they were not  
placed at much inconvenience  
by the Military using their  
empty tar barrels.
