The military took possession of these premises for three days in or about 27th April 1916, after arresting Claimant's husband and another male companion who were in the building. These were subsequently released.

The claim for building is for damage to door, ceiling and back window broken. Claimant is not the owner of the building and these items must be eliminated as well as the Consequential Loss damage as detailed above. Claimant has a Plate Glass Policy with the "National General" covering four panes of glass and the measurements given in the policy agree with the dimensions of the windows in front: these were not damaged.

Award of Committee: Contents

I have reason to believe that the details are exaggerated and I cannot trace some of the articles enumerated. I therefore base my valuation on 50% of the Stock in Trade item. Claimant states that the property as enumerated is absolutely her own.
