REPORT FOR 1911.

THE Select Vestry in presenting the Church Accounts for the past year, are glad to report that the financial position of the Parish is in a satisfactory condition.

The clergy also present the audited accounts of the Parish Charities, Missionary and other Funds.

There are thirteen accounts printed within the report.

1. The Sustentation Fund, which provides for the support of the Ministry, shows a credit balance of £5 9s. 4d.

Last year's account closed with a small deficit, so it is gratifying to see that during 1911 some new subscribers have come forward and placed the balance on the right side.

The annual repair charges on the Vicarage, amounting to f_{19} 12s., have again been discharged from this fund.

II. The Church Expenses Fund represents the amount received from the Offertories and Rents and expended on the up-keep of the Church fabric and the maintenance of the Services.

Considering the long period during which the Church was under repair and partially closed, it is satisfactory to notice that the Church Offertories are only less than those of last year by about £30. This means that the Sunday and Week-day Collections are still well up to the average of past years.

There is a balance to credit on this account of £36 IIS. 8d.

III. Molesworth Hall Account. This valuable piece of parochial property continues to be a source of considerable income to the Parish.

For the present the annual surplus is being paid into the "Church Roof Account."

The Vestry record their thanks to the Hon. Treasurer (Mr. C. A. Owen, C.E.) for the constant attention he gives to the management of this property.

IV. Church Improvement Fund. So much has been said already concerning this fund in the Parish Magazine that it is unnecessary to enter into any details here.

A list of subscriptions is now printed in full and it will be seen that when all the contributions are paid in the Fund will be closed free of debt.

The generous manner in which the congregation have contributed towards this Fund is a splendid tribute of their interest in and attachment to the Church.

- V. Church Roof Account. It will take some years to clear off the debt on this account. By resolution of the Vestry a charge has been placed on the annual income of the Molesworth Hall property to secure repayment to the Bank. Already over £300 has been paid in from this source.
- VI. The Poor Fund. The Vicar would like to see more subscribers to this important Fund. The amount available for relief falls very short of what is required.

The Fund is most carefully administered, but the fact that it is not in debt merely means that much that might and ought to have been done for the poor and sick has been left undone owing to the want of money.

VII. The Magazine Account. The Vestry congratulate the Editor and Manager and Miss Harrison on the continued prosperity of the Magazine. For the last three years the Magazine has been able, without any outside help, to pay its own way.

VIII. & IX. The Boys' Brigade and Sunday School. The Brigade Officers return their sincere thanks for the sympathy and support they receive from the congregation. The subscriptions given to the Sunday School Fund have enabled the teachers to reward the more diligent scholars with prizes and with both a winter and summer treat.

X. The Clothing and Coal Clubs continue their useful work among the poor. As usual the Christmas Day Offertories have been devoted to these Clubs, and made up the bonus paid out to the members. The Vestry record their sincere thanks to Miss Meade, Miss Grierson and Miss M. Scott for the kind interest they take in managing these charities.

XI. The Missionary Union. There is a slight falling off in the support given to the Union during the past year.

This decrease in receipts is mainly due to a distinct shrinkage in the Gift Day proceeds.

On the other hand the King's Messengers have had a very successful session, and their contributions to Missionary work show an increase.

XII. & XIII. The Protestant Orphan Society (St. Ann's Auxiliary) and the Belfast Appeal Fund (St. Ann's Auxiliary) have both received generous support.
