In connection with the claim lodged on behalf of the above named firm in respect of stock in trade, fixtures, etc., Mr. Fahey, the proprietor of the business, is very much embarrassed at present by reason of the fact that his creditors are pressing him for payment of his accounts. In addition, he has a considerable overdraft with the National Bank, Great Britain Street, and the interest on this is accumulating. I may add that Mr. Fahey's entire assets were comprised in the business at Henry Street, and since April he has had considerable difficulty in evening finding the necessary means of livelihood.

The case is a very urgent and desirable one; and under the circumstances, I would be glad if your Committee could see their way to make a payment of say £6,000 to Mr. Fahey on account of his losses.







SHOP FRONTS & ENCLOSURES

INTERIOR FIXTURES, COUNTERS & CASES

A.

Wall fixture open front with moulded cornice & skirting, back lined with matching, size 42 ft. long x 9 ft. high x 1 ft. 9" deep, one end tapered down to finish under stairs.

Hardwood counter, framed and moulded front and ends, back fitted with centre shelf and potboard, mahogany top French polished, 42 ft. long x 2 ft. 6" wide x 3 ft. high.

One fixture for blankets, size about 8 ft. x 5 ft. x 9 ft high formed with framed and moulded panelled front and end, sheeted back and one end, wood top with moulded cornice and moulded skirting, interior fitted with moveable wood shelves.

One wall mirror fixed at side of blanket fixture 6 ft. wide x 9 ft. high overall with moulded cornice and plinth.

B

Fixture open front, moulded cornice and skirting, back lined with matching, size about 29 ft. long x 9 ft. high x 1 ft. 6" deep. Private office formed at one end, with moulded and panelled screens, glazed at top part with embossed glass, size about 4 ft. 6" x 3 ft. 6" x 9 ft. high.

Hardwood counter as previously specified 29 ft. long x 2 ft. wide x 3 ft. high, mahogany top.

C.

Fixture open front as before specified 29 ft. long x 9 ft. high x 1 ft. 6" deep. Cash Office formed at one end to match Private Office.

Wall fixture as before specified about 23 ft. long x 9 ft. high x 1 ft. 3" deep. Two hardwood counters as before specified, one 26 ft. long & one 19 ft. long with returned end to wall fixture forming a hinged flap.

D.

Wall fixture as before specified about 24 ft. long x 9 ft. high x 1 ft. 3" deep, one end finishing under stairs.

Hardwood counter 32 ft. long, with returned end to wall fixture forming a hinged flap.

E.

Wall fixture on three sides of wall, two lengths about 40 ft. long, and one length 25 ft. x (9 ft. high x 1 ft. 3" deep.)

Range of hardwood counters in front of above fixture, one length 45 ft. one length 35 ft. with mahogany tops: one length 45 ft. with a hinged flap at one end opposite stairs, this counter fitted on top with glass counter cases about 9" high x 2 ft. wide with mirror lined doors at back and sliding cloth covered trays, length of these cases about 40 ft.

Two centre showcases standing at entrances clear plate glass on four sides, size 7 ft. high x 3 ft. wide x 2 ft. deep.

F.

Wall fixture 20 ft. long x 9 ft. high x 1 ft. 9" deep, the bottom part up to a height of 2 ft. to be fitted with drawers on metal runners in suitable lengths, above this to the height of 9 ft. open fronts, to match those before specified.

Hardwood counter 15 ft. long x 2 ft. wide x 3 ft. high, top to be fitted with glass counter cases as before specified.

Mantle showcase 25 ft. long x 9 ft. high x 2 ft. 6" deep with sliding doors at front, glazed with clear plate glass. Top and back sheeted and canvassed and papered, inside of this case fitted with brass mantle rail. Showcase 29 ft. long x 9 ft.

high x 2 ft. deep, the base up to a height of 2 ft. to be fitted with drawers on metal runners. Top portion fitted at front with sliding doors, glazed with clear plate glass, the back to be mirror lined & top canvassed and papered.

Mantle case in two sections fitted between columns, the columns faced with mirrors three in all, the total length 20 ft. x 2 ft.6" deep x 9 ft. high over all.

Showcase in centre of F. Dept. 7 ft. long x 3 ft. wide x 7 ft. high, four sides glazed with clear plate glass.

G.

Millinery showcase 25 ft. long x 9 ft. high x 2 ft. deep. Sliding doors at front, glazed with clear plate glass, mirror lined back, moulded cornice and plinth.

One Millinery showcase as above size 29 ft. long x 9 ft. high x 2 ft. deep. Showcase for costumes 30 ft. long x 9 ft. high x 2 ft. 6" deep: sliding doors at front glazed clear plate glass, canvassed and papered back.

H.

Two Showcases 12 ft. long x 9 ft. high x 2 ft. deep. Doors at front glazed clear plate glass, canvassed & papered backs, moulded cornice and plinth.

Two showcases to match size 6 ft. long x 9 ft. high x 2 ft. deep. One hardwood counter 8 ft. long x 2 ft. wide x 3 ft. high fitted at top with glass counter case as before specified.

One glass entablature in hardwood frame, about 15 ft. long x 1 ft.3" wide, lettered with various departments in gold, fixed on face of beam.
