Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter dated 24th November relative to above claim and would ask you to bring the matter under the notice of your Committee, that before making their award I was not interviewed or consulted by any one on their behalf, relative to the articles destroyed, had such been done I feel assured a much larger award would have been made.

The Articles destroyed were in my father's possession for over sixty years, and in mine for thirty five years, and as stated in my claim cost five pounds, any assessor or valuer would know they must be of greater value being antique at time of destruction, however I only claim what I believe they originally cost being backed up in this statement by persons who had seen them, I am prepared to swear that Mr Kane whom I left them with to be re-silvered plated, stated they were worth from three to five pounds at the time.

If these matters are laid before your Committee I am convinced that they will see I have not been treated fairly in the award and will reconsider same.
