
Dear Mr. Friery,

I recollect attending a horse for Mr. Patrick Quinn, of Tokay House, Fairview, immediately after the rebellion. It was an animal of the Hunter class, about 16 hands high and a likely horse to suit the Army. There was a transverse wound on the knee, which in my opinion could have been caused by a gun shot. The animal was permanently blemished and its value greatly depreciated.
