Claimant loaned these Rat Traps to the Minister of the Church which was destroyed. He was obtaining no remuneration for loan. The cost price of the Traps was 17/-, and after deducting a reasonable sum for depreciation - 13/- is a fair figure to assume as their value at the time of the fire.
